

ORDINANCE 2012-26

ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 14-1003, (2) OF THE MILLINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS, the City of Millington has previously adopted Title 14, Chapter 10, Flood Damage Prevention, of the Millington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) requires that the City amend said Chapter 10 so that the City’s floodplain management regulations meet the standards of Paragraph 60.3(d) of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) regulations not later than February 6, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen desire to amend Section 14-1003 of the Millington Municipal Code to adopt the current effective Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report and Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) to which the NFIP regulations apply and other modifications made by this map revision;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Millington, Tennessee, that in order to comply with the FEMA requirements described above, Section 14-1003 (2), Basis for establishing the areas of special flood hazard, of the Millington Municipal Code is deleted in its entirety and is replaced by the following new Section 14-1003 (2):

“14-1003(2) Basis for establishing the areas of special flood hazard. The areas of special flood hazard identified on the City of Millington, Tennessee, Federal Emergency Management Agency, Flood Insurance Study (FIS) and Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM), community Panel Numbers 47157C0180F, 47157C0170F, 47157C0160F, 47157C0065F, 47157C0155F, and 47157CIND0A dated February 6, 2013, along with all supporting technical data, are adopted by reference and declared to be a part of this chapter. These shall be incorporated into the Millington, Tennessee Zoning Map.”

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that except as expressly amended hereby, Title 14, Chapter 10 of the Millington Municipal Code remains in full force and effect as previously adopted.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage on third and final reading, the public welfare requiring it.
