COVID-19 Vaccine Info

The City of Memphis is now operating public COVID-19 Vaccination Sites, Mondays – Saturdays from 9 a.m. – 6 p.m. Appointment sign-up links will now be released on Fridays at noon for appointments for the following week.

Only citizens who meet the eligibility criteria will be vaccinated, and appointments are required. Citizens should not arrive more than an hour before the scheduled appointment time. Citizens who do not have an appointment will be turned away.

Wear Masks, Show You Care!

With communities beginning to reopen their economies, the federal government is recommending people consistently wear cloth face masks in public places and in businesses where social distancing is difficult to maintain. The use of masks can reduce transmission of the virus by people who have it but aren't experiencing symptoms.

PUTTING IT ON	WHILE WEARING IT	REMOVAL
 With clean hands, fit the mask to cover your mouth, nose and chin.	 Don't pull your mask down.  If you touch it, wash your hands and put on a clean one. Don't continue to use your mask if it gets damp. Replace it.	 Handling only the straps, untie or unloop your mask from behind and pull it away from your face.
 Secure it tightly to minimize gaps between your face and the mask.	 Do not touch the front of the mask, your eyes, nose or mouth.	 Immediately throw the mask in the laundry, or the trash if it's intended for single use. Wash your hands.
